CODE OF CONDUCT

Tri-Village promotes the safety and well-being of all participants in player-centric program where young people grow up happy, healthy, and, above all, safe. Tri-Village has established a zero-tolerance culture that does not tolerate any type of abuse against a minor, including, but not limited to, sexual, physical, mental, and emotional (as well as any type of bullying, hazing, or harassment) between players, coaches, parents/guardians/caretakers, spectators, volunteers, and/or any other individual.

This Code of Conduct applies to anyone who has *any* involvement in a local baseball program, including, but not limited to, Boards of Directors, volunteers, managers, coaches, umpires, spectators, and players.

In an effort to provide a positive experience for all participants and guests and to promote good sportsmanship, Tri-Village Baseball has adopted the following: No Manager, Coach, Player, Spectator, or League Official shall AT ANY TIME:

1. Use obscene or indecent language.
2. Verbally or physically attack or threaten to attack another person.
3. Use illegal substances (i.e. narcotics) on Tri-Village property.
4. Criticize any team, its players, umpires, coaches, or fans by word of mouth or gesture.
5. Demonstrate or incite others to demonstrate unsportsmanlike conduct.
6. Arrive at any baseball park under the influence of alcohol or non-prescription drugs.

TRI-VILLAGE CODE OF CONDUCT

- I will treat all players, coaches, umpires, parents, and spectators with dignity and respect, as I would like to be treated, using appropriate language in appropriate tones when interacting with them.
- I will support and cheer for all players and enjoy the skill and competition and will not intimidate or ridicule the other team or its fans. I will show respect for the opposing players, coaches, spectators, and support groups.
- I will respect the integrity and judgment of the game umpires, understand that they are doing their best to help promote the youth baseball athletes, and admire their willingness to participate in full view of the public.

Tri-Village Baseball Board Members or its umpires can (and should) remove anyone who violates this Code of Conduct from the premises and can prohibit them from attending future contests due to undesirable behaviors in accordance with the Zero Tolerance Policy.
